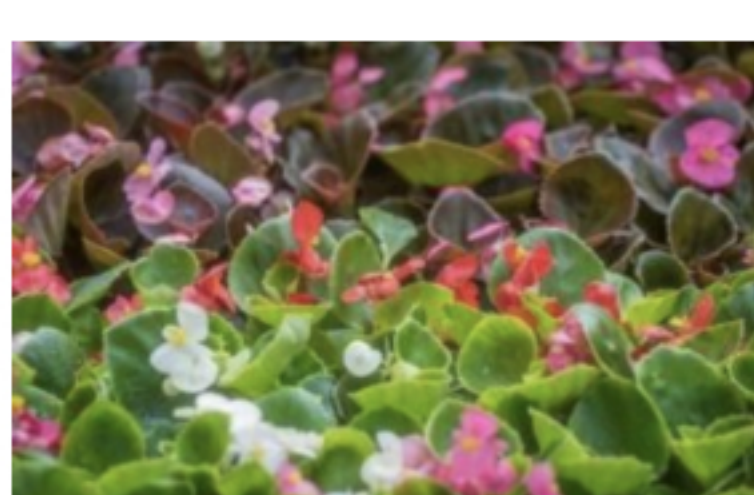
### PHS Members Plant Dividend
