

This year marks the 500th anniversary of the 1517 edition of Hortus Sanitatis, a late medieval compendium with over 1,000 charming and sometimes enigmatic woodcuts of plants, animals, and birds as well as mythical creatures. Just 25 years later, Leonhart Fuchs published his landmark work De Historia Stirpium, 1542. This exhibit lets viewers compare two remarkably different ways in which the natural world was depicted.
