



Dear Marion,

Rare plants and amphibians living in the Cape Floristic Region of Africa's southwestern tip need [your help](#) as invasive alien plants destroy their remaining ecosystem.

The smallest of six "floral kingdoms" found worldwide, this area is one of the most biodiverse regions on Earth. This landscape is home to more than 9,000 vascular plant species—69% of them endemic. Many range-restricted amphibians, like the Rough Moss Frog (CR), Cape Flats Frog (CR) and Western Leopard Toad (EN) also thrive in this rich terrain.

Non-native invasive plants affect water availability and soil quality. As a result, more than 1,700 native plant species and many amphibians face extinction. Rainforest Trust and our partner, Endangered Wildlife Trust, are working to protect 9,363 acres through formal agreements with landowners.
